# PASTORAL WORD FOR KRLC, from Kris Garey, member of Sabbatical Committee.

Dear Congregation-- Our KRLC sabbatical committee is surprised at how quickly the month of Pastor Susan's sabbatical has gone. While so glad she has had time of refreshment and relaxation, we are even more glad that she will soon be home with us. The solid constancy which God provides in her ministry is so obvious, but we are now especially noticing the fullness of her ministry, for when any question arises, we each start to say, "Well, just ask Pastor Susan. She'll know!" Questions can be large (what is on our horizon for Sundays come spring) or small (where the heck is the wireless mic)--the answer that pops to mind is the same: "ask Pastor Susan." Then we realize anew a sabbatical time value: allow our Pastor to set aside that multitude of roles and details, relax, and see new revelations of God's activity. And, give us all a fuller understanding of the many ways God calls us each, and together, within the ministries at Knife River.

Your sabbatical committee thanks all of you! You might think you haven't been involved, but you have! Communications (bulletins, newsletters, e-mails etc.), Lectio gatherings, leadership meetings, plannings for Palm Sunday Pancakes after worship, prayers for Pastor Susan and Phil, for the world, and one another—all continue. Sunday worship has been meaningful--our Synod Bishop, Amy Odgren, has lead worship; congregation members Tim Anderson, Nancy Hong, and myself have also helped in presiding and preaching; Sunday worship has been uplifted by wonderful musicianship. Kay Bloom and Randi Alreck (and others of KRL) have visited "at-home members." And our Sunday, after worship coffee-time continues to draw us all into deeper fellowship. Whew---it has been good to be adapting, each Sunday, each week, each (there is almost always something happening here). But-the comfort, constancy and heartfelt congregational care, along with Pastoral and Worship Leadership of Pastor Susan will be welcomed home with appreciation—and great joy! In February and March, we, with Christians across all the earth, have been in the Season of Lent. Now we all move toward Holy Week. Our Worship, readings, hymns, and prayers will recall Jesus' journey to the Cross. This can be a time of deep thought, even sorrow as we recognize that Jesus was in a time of dense treachery and cruelty: disciples desert, soldiers arrest, trials deride, crowds who cheered will jeer, nails pierce flesh and wood, abandonment and death descend. Jesus, Son of God, was fully human; his sorrow and pain were fully real. Yet, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Week, and the recognition of Jesus' determination for us, will also lead us toward Easter Sunday, the Resurrection of Our Lord Sunday on March 31<sup>st</sup>. Then we can pull out all the stops on organ, in music, in voices singing, and in hearts resounding with shouts of Allelulia--for Jesus has put death to death, and raises us, even as we live, into lives that more fully know, and show, the Greatest Love: God, in Jesus, Loving us so fully that we let ourselves more fully love God, God's creation, self, and all other human folks included. The Holy Spirit of God, will be, as always, tapping shoulders and hearts, so that we look out and see, God's Love is wildly and lavishly poured out. Thanks be to God!


